Text:

1 Corinthians 11:23

For I received from the Lord that which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the *same* night in which He was betrayed took bread; 24 and when He had given thanks, He broke *it* and said, “Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.” 25 In the same manner *He* also *took* the cup after supper, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as

often as you drink *it*, in remembrance of Me.”

26 For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death till He comes.

Examine Yourself

27 Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks *this* cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. **28** But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup. **29** For he who eats and drinks in an unworthy manner eats and drinks judgment to himself, not discerning the Lord’s body. **30** For this reason many *are* weak and sick

among you, and many sleep. **31** For if we would judge ourselves, we would not be judged. **32** But when we are judged, we are chastened by the Lord, that we may not be condemned with the world.

33 Therefore, my brethren, when you come together to eat, wait for one another. **34** But if anyone is hungry, let him eat at home, lest you come together for judgment. And the rest I will set in order when I come.

1 Corinthians 15

1 Moreover, brethren, I declare to you the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received and in which you stand, 2 by which also you are saved, if you hold fast that

word which **I preached** to you—
unless you believed in vain.

3 For **I delivered** to you first of
all that which **I also received**: that
Christ died for our sins according
to the Scriptures, **4** and that He
was buried, and that He rose again
the third day according to the
Scriptures, **5** and that He was seen
by Cephas, then by the twelve.
6 After that He was seen by over
five hundred brethren at once, of
whom the greater part remain to
the present, but some have fallen
asleep. **7** After that He was seen by
James, then by all the apostles.
8 Then last of all He was seen by
me also, as by one born out of due
time.

9 For I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.
10 But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me was not in vain; but I labored more abundantly than they all, yet not I, but the grace of God *which was with me.* 11 Therefore, whether *it was* I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

Luke 22:14–23 **14** When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. **15** Then He said to them, “**With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer;**

16 for I say to you, I will no longer eat of it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.”

17 Then He took the cup, and gave thanks, and said, “Take this and divide *it* among yourselves; **18** for I say to you, I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.”

19 And He took bread, gave thanks and broke *it*, and gave *it* to them, saying, “This is My body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of Me.”

20 Likewise He also *took* the cup after supper, saying, “This cup is the new covenant in My blood, which is shed for you. **21** But behold, the hand of My betrayer *is*

with Me on the table. **22** And truly the Son of Man goes as it has been determined, but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!”

23 Then they began to question among themselves, which of them it was who would do this thing.
